The very widespread false teaching that "once you are saved, you are always saved" is one of the deadliest deceptions ever seen in modern Christian times. Millions could be lulled into a false security that will lead them to eternal loss! Let's look at some more scripture.

from the infection of sin. The wages of sin is death but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our LORD. (Rom. 6:23) The gospel clearly says that a big part of this gift is God's grace which helps us to overcome sin.

But wait, God cannot and will not save a sin-infected human against their will and nature. To do that God would have to make this person like an automated robot and do what He wants them to do. This is not the God of the Bible that we serve. Nowhere in sacred scripture do we see such a teaching!

It is as simple as that. Why not send up a prayer now confessing all your known sins, surrender your heart to Him and this incredible peace and joy can be yours for the asking. He is longing to have your heart and highest affections. If you genuinely do this you will experience a joy, happiness and peace you never thought possible!!
